The young boy saw the congregation's intensity and wanted to join in as well. However, all he knew was the sounds made by different farm animals. So he began to crow like a rooster!

The students of the Bal Shem Tov were confused to hear a voice crowing like a rooster, and a few of them started to quiet him down. But the Bal Shem Tov turned around and told them to continue the Neilah prayers.

As Yom Kippur ended, the Baal Shem Tov's face glowed with radiant light as he told his students that there was a bad decree written in heaven. But no matter how hard he tried to fight it, he was unsuccessful. However, when heaven heard the young boy's crying out with all his heart like a rooster, the evil decree was canceled!

During this unprecedented Rosh Hashanah, as we crown Hashem as the one and only true King, you must know that no matter where you find yourself, it is your sincerity that truly counts. Whether you are in shul, at an outdoor minyan, or home alone, it is how genuine and heartfelt you are that actually matters to Hashem.

May we all be blessed with a year of purpose and meaning. A year of strength and health. A year of true happiness and prosperity!
